The Johnson family is one of the many that POR keeps in touch with frequently. They live in the Carolinas, and Barbara is the hen of the family, the one you can call the caretaker. Through her stories, texts, and letters she is keeping POR in the loop on family affairs.

The Johnsons found POR through a random search through a social worker at the hospital. At the time Barbara's brother, Alphonso "Al" Canady, was being treated for pancreatic cancer. When he passed, the family needed some help with some of the funeral expenses, and although POR didn't know anything about them, just speaking with Barbara made us feel like instant family immediately.

One of Barbara's best skills is the gift of gab. She is the best storyteller, often going into a dialogue between her and another person she knows or met and acting out both persons voices in her story! You could say southern charm and the warmest heart in the world are in her blood, too.

Back to Al Canady, he is described as a very humble, driven, and loyal person by his friends and family. Mr. Canady loved his kids very much and would do whatever he could to provide for them. He was one of eight children, all being very close-knit. They had a very strong faith and would regularly send scripture to each another.

Barbara Johnson is the oldest, and she has tried to make sure that Mr. Canady's children are all taken care of in his absence. Al left behind 3 children ranging from 6 to 17 years old. When he was finally diagnosed with pancreatic cancer he was only given 2 months to live. This is often the case with pancreatic cancer, as it is a confusing disease to detect early on or doctors aren't aware of the symptoms that come along with it.

So POR helped with making the funeral less of a financial burden for the family, it is what

Nancy Pants would have wanted and done. Not to forget about the holidays and the children, we made sure that the kids had something to smile about in such a difficult time. POR sent a bunch of gifts to the kids. Barbara still remembers that for a week straight there were ne packages at the doorstep each day. Amazon is a beautiful thing! Pat Amato still remembers getting calls each day about a mountain bike that one of the meerkats was so generous to send them. Barbara was so worried it would get stolen from the doorstep that she had a neighborhood watch for this package. In the end the package made it, and one of Al's kids was riding a bike around Raleigh that Christmas! Katie Amato also made sure that the family had desert for the Christmas, sending a Nancy Cake to eat after their family dinner.

Barbara was quoted by the POR Tribune as saying, "Pants Off Racing has been a godsend. Pants Off Racers are my guardian angels. They really care about people and put their hearts into everything that they do." She couldn't believe that Pat called her the next year to ask what the kids needed for Christmas, and she looks forward to meeting POR's members in the future.

Barbara is still asking when she can take a tour of POR and learn about how she can help. We haven't had the heart to tell her POR is just a loft at Meerkat Manor and the rest is just the people that help us generate spirit and an occasional gift or reminder that someone is thinking of our recipients. Either way if she is in LA you may want to come by and hear the master story teller in person!
