They are focused on research and don't help with basic needs of the family. That is where POR comes in. We **aim to be direct advocates for the families and align ourselves with the financial needs they have**. Strong Faith & Family

Unwavering strength and optimism. Those who knew Rachel Corscadden said those traits defined her battle with breast cancer, right up until her final days.

Rachel Corscadden mother of two boys, Graham (age 7) and Liam (age 3), passed on March 8, 2017 at 32 years old after a breast cancer battle of nearly four years. Her husband, Eric, and friends remember her as a bright, loving person who everyone seemed to know.

"She was super fun, always knew how to make you laugh and lighten up the conversation, especially after being sick. People would get nervous about talking about it, the cancer and the diagnosis and the prognosis, and she would always lighten the mood," a close friend said.

Rachel Corscadden was **diagnosed with stage 4 breast cancer at age 28 while 22 weeks pregnant with her younger son** and began chemotherapy treatments immediately. Liam, who she called her "miracle baby," now wants to be a police officer or a firefighter like his father. Eric Corscadden said he still recalls the joy of his second child's birth, in the midst of chemo treatments and uncertainty.

Through her family and friends support and her own faith, Rachel Corscadden **kept up her fight against breast cancer until the end**. "Her goal in hospice was to get kicked out of hospice. That was her attitude. She was going to fight till the end for

those children and her husband," a close friend said.

But she made it clear that, through her faith, she would win no matter the outcome. By the support and love given to her sweet boys, we continue Rachel's love and legacy for her family.

POR was fortunate to connect with the family and send some gifts for the boys. Although we have never met, it is hard to not feel for the young family. Also, even though we focus on pancreatic cancer we do lend a hand with any serious disease. It is more about helping and supporting families in difficult times than it is about anything else. I can't help but say Thank You and I'm excited to continue being humbled on a daily basis by every amazing family, survivor, child, volunteer and friend that both of these nonprofits bring into my life.
